Bearing Fruit

(John 15:8)

Introduction:

- 1. The Bible contains many passages that relate to "bearing fruit."
- 2. Studying these verses will help us better understand the instruction that Jesus gave to His followers in John 15:8.

Discussion:

- I. VERSES FROM THE OLD TESTAMENT
 - A. "Being fruitful" is first mentioned in connection with populating the earth.
 - 1. Genesis 1:27-28
 - 2. Genesis 8:15-17
 - 3. Genesis 9:1, 7
 - B. A tree bearing fruit illustrates the blessing of a righteous person (Psalm 1:1-3).
- II. VERSES FROM THE GOSPELS
 - A. Bearing the right kind of fruit is an indication that a person has repented (Matthew 3:8).
 - B. Trees that do not bear good fruit will be burned (Matthew 3:10).
 - C. The fruit produced by a tree is an indication of the true nature of the tree (Luke 6:43-45).
 - D. The fruit produced by various types of soil identify the true nature of the soils (Luke 8:8, 15).
 - E. Certain obstacles to bearing fruit are listed in Luke 8:14.
 - F. Even though the Lord is patient, He expects His followers to bear fruit (Luke 13:6-9).
 - G. Jesus cursed a fig tree because it did not bear fruit (Matthew 21:18-20).
- III. VERSES FROM THE EPISTLES
 - A. Bearing "the fruit of the Spirit" is an indication that one is walking in "light" (Ephesians 5:8-10).
 - B. Hearing the Gospel correctly results in "bringing forth fruit" (Colossians 1:5-6).
 - C. Hebrews 6:4-6 is often misunderstood, but the illustration from fruit bearing in vs.7-8 helps to explain the point being made.

Conclusion:

- 1. The Bible has much to say about bearing fruit.
- 2. Let us benefit from the principles revealed in the Bible to glorify God and show that we are the Lord's disciples (John 15:8).
