# Christ Authorizes His Followers to Use Their Talents

(1 Peter 4:10-11)

#### Introduction:

- 1. Several passages in the New Testament teach Christians to use their talents.
  - a. 1 Peter 4:10-11
  - b. Romans 12:4-8
- 2. These verses are sufficient to show that "Christ authorizes His followers to use their talents;" however, in our lesson we are concentrating on "the parable of the talents" (Matthew 25:14-30).
- 3. Let us begin by examining . . .

## Discussion:

## I. THE SETTING FOR THIS PARABLE

- A. (Matthew 24:1-3) Jesus informed His disciples that the temple would be destroyed, and they asked Him when that great event would occur.
  - 1. From the questions that they asked (vs.3), it seems that the apostles thought the temple would be destroyed when Jesus returns.
  - 2. They wanted Jesus to give them a sign of His return.
- B. (Matthew 24:4-35) Jesus talked about the destruction of Jerusalem, and He gave a number of signs relating to it.
- C. (Matthew 24:36-51) Jesus talked about His return.
  - 1. (vs.36) No one knows when Jesus will return -- there will be no signs.
  - 2. Jesus said "watch" (vs.42) and "be ready" (vs.44).
- D. The Lord's teaching continues in Matthew 25.
  - 1. In "the parable of the virgins" (vs.1-13), Jesus emphasized the importance of being ready for His return.
  - 2. In "the parable of the talents,":
    - a. Jesus showed His followers how to be ready for His return
    - b. Jesus showed us <u>why</u> we must be ready for His return -- when He returns we will face Him in judgment.

#### II. THE PARABLE

- A. (vs.14-15) A man going on a long journey divided his goods among his servants.
  - 1. It seems that he would be gone for an extended time, but he did not say exactly how long he would be gone.
  - 2. He wanted his goods to be taken care of while he was gone, so he entrusted them to his servants.
  - 3. He gave his goods to his servants according to their individual ability -- this indicates that he knew the capabilities of each servant.
    - a. To one servant he gave 5 talents.
    - b. To one servant he gave 2 talents.
    - c. To one servant he gave 1 talent.
    - d. Note that there were no 0-talent servants.
  - 4. A "talent" was a considerable amount of money.
  - 5. This man was trusting his servants to care for his goods while he was gone.
  - 6. The servants would be responsible for the way they used his goods.
  - 7. He left on his journey.
- B. (vs.16-18) We learn what the servants did with their master's goods.
  - 1. (vs.16) The servant who had been given 5 talents gained 5 more.
  - 2. (vs.17) The servant who had been given 2 talents gained 2 more.
  - 3. (vs.18) The servant who had been given 1 talent hid his in the ground.
- C. (vs.19-30) The master reckoned with his servants.
  - 1. (vs.19) After a long time the master returned and asked his servants to account for the way they had used his goods.

- 2. (vs.20-21) The servant who had been given 5 talents was blessed for his faithfulness.
- 3. (vs.22-23) The servant who had been given 2 talents was blessed for his faithfulness.
- 4. (vs.24-30) The servant who had been given 1 talent was cursed for his wickedness and slothfulness.
  - a. This servant tried to make excuses.
    - 1) (vs.24) He told his master about how hard he was.
    - 2) (vs.25) He revealed his main problem: FEAR.
    - 3) He tried to return the talent he had been given.
  - b. The master did not accept the talent or his excuses.
  - c. This servant was cast into outer darkness.

#### III. APPLICATION

# A. The symbolism:

- 1. The man going on a long trip refers to the time between the Lord's ascension and return.
- 2. The servants refer to the Lord's followers.
- 3. The master's return and the reckoning of the servants refer to the Lord's return and the judgment.
- 4. The blessing refers to eternal life in heaven, and the curse refers to eternal condemnation.
- B. Let us put ourselves into the parable.
  - 1. (Romans 12:4-8) He has given us different gifts that He expects us to use.
  - 2. (1 Peter 4:10) He wants us to be "good stewards" of His blessings.
  - 3. Stewards have 1 main requirement: FAITHFULNESS (1 Corinthians 4:2).
  - 4. When Jesus returns we will be judged on the basis of how we use the blessings that He gives us.
  - 5. We learn from the 1 talent man that God will not accept excuses.
  - 6. We must not allow fear to prevent us from doing the Lord's will.
  - 7. If we use the blessings that the Lord entrusts to our care He will bless us with more, and we will be prepared to face Him in judgment.

#### Conclusion:

- 1. How can we be ready for the Lord's return? (By using the talents and blessings that He gives us)
- 2. Why must be ready for the Lord's return? (When He returns we will face Him in judgment and give an account of how we have used His blessings)
