We Are Saved By Grace Through Faith (Ephesians 2:8-9)

Introduction:

- 1. This morning our lesson was based on the information presented in Ephesians 2:10 --God wants His children to walk in good works.
- 2. This evening we are concentrating on several principles revealed in Ephesians 2:8-9.
 - a. We are saved by grace through faith.
 - b. We cannot save ourselves -- salvation "is the gift of God."
 - c. Salvation is "not of works, lest any man should boast."
- 3. Unfortunately, these verses are often misunderstood -- they have been misinterpreted to teach that man has no responsibilities concerning his salvation.
- 4. According to 2 Timothy 2:15, we are required to "rightly divide" the Scriptures.
- 5. We are presenting some information that will help us in teaching these verses accurately so we can be effective in evangelism.

Discussion:

- LET US FIRST CONSIDER THE "WORKS" THAT ARE MENTIONED
 - A. These verses clearly state that salvation is "not of works, lest any man should boast."
 - B. This is interesting because James stated that faith must be accompanied by "works" (James 2:17, 20, 24, 26).
 - C. Paul and James do not contradict each other because they each wrote about a particular kind of work.
 - 1. In Ephesians 2, Paul wrote about "works of merit."
 - a. These are things that a person does to earn his salvation.
 - b. Such works will not save anyone because salvation is God's gift.
 - 2. In James 2, James wrote about "works of obedience."
 - a. These are things that a person does to comply with the Lord's instructions.
 - b. We must remember that Christ saves those who obey Him (Hebrews 5:9).
- II. LET US CONSIDER 2 MIRACLES OF HEALING THAT ILLUSTRATE HOW WE ARE SAVED BY GRACE THROUGH FAITH
 - A. (2 Kings 5:1-14) Naaman was cleansed of leprosy.
 - 1. (vs.1-4) Naaman learned that Elisha could cure him.
 - 2. (vs.5-7) The king of Syria and the king of Israel were involved.
 - 3. (vs.8-10) Elisha sent instructions to Naaman.
 - 4. (vs.11-12) Naaman had his own ideas about how he should have been cured.
 - 5. (vs.13-14) After listening to his servants Naaman followed Elisha's instructions, and he was cured.
 - 6. By the grace of God Naaman was cured; however, it was necessary for Naaman to demonstrate his faith by washing 7 times in the Jordan River.
 - B. (John 9:1-7) A man born blind received his sight.
 - 1. (vs.1-5) Jesus and His disciples came in contact with a man born blind.
 - 2. (vs.6-7a) Jesus put clay on the man's eyes and told him what to do.
 - 3. (vs.7b) The man followed the Lord's instructions, and he was able to see.
 - 4. By the grace of God this man received his sight; however, it was necessary for him to demonstrate his faith by washing in the pool of Siloam.

Conclusion:

- 1. In Mark 16:16, Jesus clearly stated that belief and baptism are requirements for salvation.
- 2. In Acts 8:26-40 we read about the eunuch of Ethiopia who was saved by God's grace when he demonstrated his faith by complying with the Lord's instructions.
