What Is Truth?

(John 18:37-38)

Introduction:

- 1. In our lesson we are concentrating on a question that Pilate asked Jesus in John 18:38 -- "What is truth?"
- 2. Let us begin by determining . . .

Discussion:

- I. WHAT PROMPTED PILATE TO ASK JESUS THIS QUESTION?
 - A. Jesus had been arrested and taken into custody.
 - B. Jesus was first taken before Annas, the father-in-law of Caiaphas.
 - C. Jesus was next taken before Caiaphas the high priest.
 - D. Jesus was accused of blasphemy, and He was judged to be guilty of death.
 - E. Jesus was taken before Pilate so he could give the execution order.
 - F. During Pilate's interrogation, Jesus made 2 statements in vs.37 about the truth.
 - 1. He came to "bear witness unto the truth."
 - 2. "Every one that is of the truth heareth my voice."
 - G. Pilate then asked Jesus, "What is truth?"
 - H. Jesus did not answer Pilate's question; however, . . .
- II. JESUS HAD MUCH TO SAY ABOUT "TRUTH" DURING HIS MINISTRY
 - A. (John 17:17) Jesus identified God's Word as truth, and He said that God sanctifies through His truth.
 - B. (John 14:6) Jesus identified Himself as "the truth."
 - C. (John 8:31-32) Jesus said that we can know the truth, and it will make us free.
 - D. (John 4:23-24) Jesus said that true worshippers worship the Father "in spirit and in truth."
 - E. While Jesus had much to say about truth, we are especially interested in the fact that . . .
- III. TRUTH IS AN IMPORTANT PART OF THE ARMOR OF GOD
 - A. In Ephesians 6 Christians are instructed twice to put on "the whole armor of God" (vs.11a, 13a).
 - B. Putting on the armor of God will enable Christians to "stand against the wiles of the devil" (vs.11b, vs.13b).
 - C. Our enemy is Satan.
 - 1. (John 8:44) Jesus identified Satan as "a liar."
 - 2. (Revelation 12:9) Satan is identified as a deceiver.
 - 3. Satan demonstrated his ability to lie and deceive in his dealings with Eve (Genesis 3:1-5).
 - D. According to Ephesians 6:14a, the Christian soldier is to have his "loins girt about with truth."

- E. To be able to withstand Satan, Christians must be armed with "truth."
- F. Let us turn our attention to . . .

IV. 3 SPECIFIC AREAS IN WHICH WE MUST NOT BE DECEIVED

- A. We must not be deceived about who is going to heaven (1 Corinthians 6:9-10).
 - 1. Regardless of what man says, "the unrighteous" will not inherit God's kingdom.
 - 2. "The unrighteous" include those who participate in the sins listed.
 - 3. Another list, including liars, is given in Revelation 21:8.
 - 4. The good news is that we can be cleansed of these sins (1 Corinthians 6:11).
 - 5. We learn from Acts 18:8 how the people in Corinth were cleansed.
 - 6. To be saved so we can go to heaven, we must obey the Gospel and remain faithful (Revelation 2:10).
- B. We must not be deceived about evil influence (1 Corinthians 15:33).
 - 1. The evil associates under consideration are identified in vs.12.
 - 2. We are to test the teaching we hear (1 John 4:1; Acts 17:11).
 - 3. We must receive the truth, but we must reject that which is false.
- C. We must not be deceived about the law of sowing and reaping (Galatians 6:7).
 - 1. (vs.8) Your eternal destiny will be determined by the way you sow.
 - 2. Let us follow the instructions given in vs.9-10.

Conclusion:

- 1. Was truth important to Jesus?
 - a. He came to "bear witness unto the truth" (John 18:37).
 - b. If Jesus had denied being the Son of God, Pilate may have released Him.
 - c. Rather than deny the truth, Jesus died a horrible death on the cross.
 - d. Jesus considers the truth to be a matter of utmost importance.
- 2. Have you allowed God to sanctify you through His truth?
- 3. If you have, is truth a part of your armor?
