Jesus Is the Apostle and High Priest of our Profession

(Hebrews 3:1-6)

Introduction:

- 1. Hebrews identifies itself as a "word of exhortation [encouragement]" (13:22).
- 2. Its purpose is to encourage Christians to remain faithful to the Lord.
- 3. To accomplish this purpose, Christ is highly exalted throughout the book.
 - a. (3:1-6) Christ is shown to be far greater than Moses.
 - b. When we see how Christ is so highly exalted, we should be encouraged to know Him and appreciate Him more fully.
 - c. The better we know and appreciate the Lord, the more committed we will be to Him, and the more faithfully we will serve Him.
 - d. Vs.6 stresses the importance of remaining faithful to the Lord.
- 4. In our lesson we are emphasizing the fact that we are to consider Jesus as "the Apostle and High Priest of our profession."

Discussion:

- I. JESUS IS THE APOSTLE OF OUR PROFESSION
 - A. Apostle: one who is sent forth with authority to fulfill a mission
 - 1. The limited commission illustrates the meaning of <u>apostle</u> (Luke 6:13; 9:1-2).
 - 2. Later, the Great Commission was given to the apostles (Matthew 28:16-20).
 - B. Jesus is the Apostle of our profession in that:
 - 1. He was sent forth by the Father (Galatians 4:4 "But when the fullness of the time was come, God sent forth His Son")
 - 2. He was given authority (John 17:2 Jesus said that the Father had given Him "power [authority] over all flesh")
 - 3. He was given a mission (1 John 4:14 "the Father sent the Son to be the Savior of the world").
 - a. In fulfilling His mission, Jesus tasted "death for every man" (Hebrews 2:9).
 - b. As a result of fulfilling His mission, Jesus made it possible for us to be delivered from bondage (Hebrews 2:14-15).
 - C. We are to <u>consider</u> Jesus as the Apostle of our profession.
 - 1. What does this mean?
 - a. Consider: to observe carefully, to fix the eyes upon
 - b. In Hebrews 12:1b-2a we are taught to keep our eyes focused on Jesus.
 - 2. We learn from Hebrews 12:3 why we must do this.
 - 3. Considering Jesus as the Apostle of our profession will help us to remain faithful to Him.

II. JESUS IS ALSO THE HIGH PRIEST OF OUR PROFESSION

- A. The high priest served as the main religious leader of the Jews.
 - 1. He taught the law to the Jews.
 - 2. He offered a special sacrifice for the Jews on the Day of Atonement.
- B. As the High Priest of Christians, Jesus serves as our leader.
 - 1. As God's spokesman today, He teaches us God's Word (Hebrews 1:1-2).
 - 2. He offered Himself once as a perfect sacrifice for sin (Hebrews 7:26-27).
- C. In Hebrews, Jesus is shown to be:
 - 1. a merciful and faithful High Priest (2:17-18)
 - 2. a sympathetic High Priest (4:15).
- D. We are to <u>consider</u> Jesus as the High Priest of our profession.
 - 1. We are shown in Hebrews 4:16 how to do this.
 - 2. We are shown in Hebrews 4:14 why we must do this.

Conclusion:

- 1. As an Apostle, Jesus was sent to save us from our sins, and He is able to accomplish this mission (Hebrews 7:25a).
- 2. As a High Priest, Jesus helps those who have been saved (Hebrews 7:25b).
- 3. Is Jesus your Apostle and High Priest?
