"Let Us Have Grace"

(Hebrews 12:28-29)

Introduction:

- 1. In Hebrews 12:28a a very special blessing is mentioned -- we have received *"a kingdom which cannot be moved."*
- 2. In Hebrews 12:28c an important responsibility is mentioned in connection with this blessing -- serving "God acceptably with reverence and godly fear."
- Vs.29 gives one reason why we must serve God faithfully in His everlasting kingdom --"God is a consuming fire."
 - a. The alternative to serving God faithfully in His kingdom is eternal punishment.
 - b. We want to avoid this punishment, and we want to receive the reward that God promised to His faithful servants.
- 4. To be faithful servants of God in His kingdom, we need something very special.
- 5. This brings us to the request in Hebrews 12:28b that we are emphasizing in our lesson -- *"let us have grace."*
- 6. Since "grace" is essential to our spiritual wellbeing, we must have a proper understanding of . . .

Discussion:

- I. WHAT GRACE IS
 - A. <u>Grace</u>: kindness or favor that God extends to us, even though we do not deserve it ["unmerited favor"].
 - B. To help us better understand what grace is, let us consider:
 - 1. a demonstration of God's grace in Deuteronomy 7:6-8
 - a. The word "grace" is not found in these verses.
 - b. God demonstrated His grace when He chose the Israelites as His "holy people."
 - 2. an illustration of God's grace in Luke 15:20-24.
 - a. This young man did not deserve any kind treatment from his father.
 - b. He decided to go home and ask to be made a servant (vs.18-19).
 - c. When he arrived, he received kindness he did not deserve -- his father received him back as a son.
 - d. This helps us to appreciate the statement in James 4:6: "God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble."
 - C. Now that we understand what grace is let us turn our attention to the fact that . . .
- II. WE BECOME SERVANTS OF GOD THROUGH GRACE

- A. Before we can serve God faithfully in His kingdom, we must become God's servants, and we must become members of His kingdom.
- B. The Bible teaches in Ephesians 2:8-9 that we are saved by grace through faith.
 - 1. We become God's servants when He makes us free from sin as we obey the doctrine delivered to us (Romans 6:17-18).
 - 2. This occurs when we are baptized into Christ (Romans 6:3-4).
 - 3. When we are saved God translates us into His dear Son's kingdom (Colossians 1:13-14).
- C. We need grace to become servants of God in His kingdom; however, . . .
- III. WE NEED GRACE TO SERVE GOD FAITHFULLY IN HIS KINGDOM
 - A. (Hebrews 12:28) God's people are to serve Him *"acceptably with reverence and godly fear,"* and we need grace to do this.
 - B. We learn from Titus 2:11-14 that God's grace teaches us how to live.
 - 1. (vs.12a) We are to deny "ungodliness and worldly lusts."
 - a. Some people think that God's grace allows us to live as we please.
 - b. However, this simply is not true (Romans 6:1-2).
 - 2. (vs.12b) We are to "live soberly, righteously, and godly in this present world."
 - 3. (vs.14) We are to be "a peculiar people, zealous of good works."
 - 4. (vs.13) This will allow us to look forward to the Lord's return.
