Spiritual Freedom and Liberty

(Galatians 5:1)

Introduction:

- 1. Memorial Day is a special holiday for American citizens.
- 2. Each year at this time we pay tribute to those who have given their lives so we can enjoy freedom and liberty.
- 3. Civil freedom and liberty are great blessings that we enjoy; however, "spiritual freedom and liberty" are even more special.
- 4. In our lesson we are concentrating on a number of passages from the Bible that deal with spiritual freedom and liberty.
- 5. Let us begin our study by pointing out that . . .

Discussion:

- I. CHRIST IS THE SOURCE OF SPIRITUAL FREEDOM AND LIBERTY
 - A. Galatians 5:1 mentions "the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free."
 - B. This great principle is declared in many other passages.
 - 1. (Luke 4:18) As Jesus read from Isaiah 61:1-2 in the synagogue, He showed that He came "to preach deliverance to the captives" and "to set at liberty them that are bruised."
 - 2. (John 8:36) Jesus said, "If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed."
 - C. (John 8:31-32) Jesus gave some guidelines for receiving the freedom and liberty that He provides.
 - D. This should prompt us to ask 2 questions.
 - 1. #1 What is the Lord's Word?
 - a. The Lord's Word is the New Testament.
 - b. (Hebrews 9:15) "He is the mediator of the new testament."
 - 2. #2 What is involved in continuing in the Lord's Word?
 - a. Continue: to abide in, to dwell in, to remain in
 - b. See Colossians 3:16a; James 1:25.
 - E. We have seen from these passages that:
 - 1. Christ is the source of spiritual freedom and liberty
 - 2. we must continue in the Lord's Word to receive the freedom and liberty that He provides.
- II. THE BIBLE SHOWS US WHEN THE LORD BLESSES US WITH SPIRITUAL FREEDOM AND LIBERTY
 - A. We certainly want to continue in the Lord's Word to know the truth on this matter.
 - B. (Romans 6:17-18) The Lord makes us free from sin when we obey from the heart the doctrine revealed in the Bible.
 - C. (Romans 6:3-7) He makes us free from sin when we are baptized into Him.
 - D. After we are made free, . . .
- III. CHRIST WANTS US TO REMAIN FREE
 - A. Galatians 5:1 says that we are to "stand fast" in the liberty that Christ provides.
 - B. Instructions that relate to this principle are given in:
 - 1. Galatians 5:1b -- "Be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage."
 - a. We are no longer under the Law of Moses (Galatians 3:24-25).
 - b. We must not seek to be justified by the Law of Moses (Galatians 5:4).
 - 2. Galatians 5:13 -- The liberty provided by Christ does not allow us to serve the flesh.
 - a. Many "works of the flesh" are listed in vs.19-21.
 - b. See Galatians 5:24.
