The Sword of the Spirit

(Ephesians 6:14-17)

Introduction:

- 1. In Ephesians 6:10, an important admonition is given -- God's people are to "be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might."
- 2. Vs.12 explains why we must be strong -- we are engaged in a conflict.
- 3. To win this spiritual conflict we must be properly armed (vs.11, 13).
- 4. Beginning at vs.14, the various items that make up the armor of God are listed, and they are compared to the armor used by Roman soldiers.
- 5. In our lesson we are concentrating on the sixth part mentioned in vs.17b: "the word of God" [compared to the sword used by soldiers].
- 6. The first point we need to make is that . . .

Discussion:

- I. THE SWORD WAS AN IMPORTANT PART OF A SOLDIER'S ARMOR
 - A. The soldier depended upon:
 - 1. his "belt" for support
 - 2. his "breastplate" to protect his chest and major organs
 - 3. his "shoes" for traction
 - 4. his "shield" to protect him from arrows fired from a distance
 - 5. his "helmet" to protect his head.
 - B. While the soldier depended upon these items of armor to protect him from being injured by his enemy, he mainly used his sword to injure his enemy.
 - 1. A soldier's primary offensive weapon was his sword.
 - 2. A soldier's effectiveness was determined by his ability to use his sword.
 - C. Just as the sword was an important part of a soldier's armor, . . .
- II. "GOD'S WORD" IS AN IMPORTANT PART OF THE ARMOR OF GOD
 - A. The other items include "truth," "righteousness," "the preparation of the Gospel of peace," "faith," and "salvation."
 - B. "God's Word" is also a living and powerful item of armor (Hebrews 4:12).
 - C. God's Word is identified as "the sword of the Spirit."
 - 1. The Spirit:
 - a. revealed God's Word to inspired men
 - b. guided the inspired men as they recorded God's Word.
 - 2. The process by which the Spirit did this is explained in:
 - a. 1 Corinthians 2:9-13

- b. Ephesians 3:3-5.
- D. God has revealed His Word for our benefit (2 Timothy 3:16-17).
 - 1. The Scriptures are profitable for:
 - a. "doctrine" [teaching, instruction]
 - 1) The Bible reveals the right ways that please God.
 - 2) The Bible also reveals the wrong ways that displease God.
 - b. "reproof" [conviction of sinful condition]
 - c. "correction" [restoring to an upright condition]
 - d. "instruction in righteousness" [instruction that helps us to grow and become the kind of people God wants us to be].
 - 2. The Scriptures will produce a complete person in God's sight.
- E. Our effectiveness in standing against the wiles of the devil will be determined by our ability to use the Scriptures correctly (Psalm 119:11).
 - 1. Illustrations:
 - a. Negative: Eve (Genesis 3:1-6)
 - b. Positive: Jesus (Matthew 4:1-11)
 - 2. We are to resist Satan "steadfast in the faith" (1 Peter 5:9).
 - 3. "Faith" comes by hearing God's Word (Romans 10:17).

Conclusion:

- 1. The Scriptures are an important part of the armor of God, but we must use them correctly.
- 2. They are also able to make us "wise unto salvation" (2 Timothy 3:15).
