Having Proper Priorities in God's Kingdom

(Luke 9:57-62)

Introduction:

- 1. The primary lesson to learn from Luke 9:57-62 is that "the Lord's followers must have proper priorities."
- 2. "Priorities" are those things we give our utmost attention to -- they are the things that are really important to us.
- 3. It is interesting that Jesus mentioned "the kingdom of God" twice in these passages.
- 4. To be devoted citizens in God's kingdom our priorities must be in the proper order.
- 5. Keeping our priorities in the proper order might be challenging at times, but the Lord wants us to meet that challenge.
- 6. In our lesson we are concentrating on the Lord's dealings with 3 men and their priorities.

Discussion:

- I. (vs.57-58) JESUS DEALT WITH A MAN WHO WANTED TO FOLLOW HIM
 - A. At this time Jesus was making a tremendous effort to get people to become His followers.
 - 1. (Luke 9:1-6) He sent the apostles out on the limited commission.
 - 2. (Luke 10:1-2) He later sent out the 70.
 - 3. (Luke 9:23) Jesus let people know that He expected His followers to pay whatever price was involved.
 - 4. It was when Jesus was making this great effort to get people to become His followers that .

B. (vs.57) This man said he would follow Jesus wherever He went.

- 1. This man was:
 - a. a volunteer -- he approached the Lord
 - b. a "scribe" (Matthew 8:19).
- 2. From what we know about this man up to this point, it would appear that he would have been an ideal follower of the Lord.
- C. (vs.58) However, Jesus informed him that he would have to be willing to sacrifice to follow Him.
 - 1. While foxes have their dens and birds have their nests, Jesus did not have a place to lay His head.
 - 2. If this man followed Jesus, he may not have had a place to lay his head.
- D. This man had to examine his priorities: Was having a home or following the Lord more important to him?
- II. (vs.59-60) JESUS DEALT WITH A MAN HE DID CALL

- A. The Lord told him, "Follow me."
 - 1. Implied are the instructions Jesus gave in vs.23.
 - 2. The Lord wanted this man to respond to His call as Peter, Andrew, James, John, and Matthew did (Matthew 4:18-22; 9:9).
- B. This man responded by asking the Lord to allow him **FIRST** to go and bury his father.
 - 1. This is interesting because if the father had been dead, he would have been taking care of burying him (the Jews normally buried their dead the same day they died).
 - 2. Perhaps this man's father was advanced in years and the son wanted to wait until after his death to follow Christ.
- C. Jesus responded by telling him to let others take care of this matter.
 - 1. Jesus had an important mission for this man -- to go and preach the kingdom of God.
 - 2. Jesus wasn't saying that we don't have responsibilities to care for our parents.
 - 3. This man had a problem with his priorities -- he wanted to put the care of his father before following the Lord (see Matthew 10:37).

III. (vs.61-62) JESUS DEALT WITH ANOTHER VOLUNTEER

- A. This man wanted to follow Jesus, but his priority was to **FIRST** bid farewell to those at his home.
 - 1. He wanted to place a condition on following the Lord (he imposed his own terms).
 - 2. His condition was going to cause him to take his focus off what was truly important.
- B. Jesus responded with those familiar words in vs.62.

Conclusion:

- 1. The Lord wants us to have the right priorities.
- 2. When it comes to placing our priorities, we must put first those things that are of spiritual importance (Matt. 6:33a).
- 3. The Lord will bless us for sacrifices we make on His behalf (Luke 18:29-30).
