Salt of the Earth and Light of the World

(Matthew 5:13-16)

Introduction:

- 1. In John 8:12 Jesus identified Himself as "the light of the world."
- 2. Jesus talked about this further in John 9:4-5.
 - a. He showed that He is "the light of the world" by doing the works that the Father gave Him to do.
 - b. He considered being "the light of the world" to be a lifelong commitment.
- 3. In Matthew 5:13-16 Jesus identified His followers as "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world"
 - a. We show that we are "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world" by doing the will of the Father.
 - b. The Lord also wants us to follow His example by making lifelong commitments to being "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world."
- 4. In our lesson we are studying the Lord's teaching in Matthew 5:13-16 as well as some additional passages.

Discussion:

- I. JESUS BEGAN IN VS.13 BY SAYING THAT CHRISTIANS ARE THE SALT OF THE EARTH
 - A. People familiar with salt understand that it influences things that it contacts.
 - 1. It is used as a preservative in that it prevents spoilage.
 - 2. It is also used as a seasoning in that it enhances the flavor of foods.
 - 3. As a preservative and seasoning, salt is certainly valuable.
 - B. (vs.13a) Jesus compared His followers to salt to show that we are to have a positive influence upon the world.
 - C. (vs.13b) Jesus emphasized the need for having the right kind of influence.
 - 1. Salt that has lost its saltiness is good for nothing (see Luke 14:34-35).
 - 2. Jesus wants us to have the right kind of influence, and He wants us to maintain our influence for good.
- II. JESUS CONTINUED IN VS.14-16 BY SAYING THAT CHRISTIANS ARE THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD
 - A. Light is similar to salt in that it is also very useful and influential.
 - 1. It dispels darkness.
 - 2. It causes plants to grow.
 - 3. Sunlight can change a person's disposition for the better.
 - B. Jesus also used this comparison to teach His followers to have a positive influence upon the world.
 - C. (vs.15-16) We must not hide our lights -- we must let them shine before men.
 - 1. This is accomplished by doing good works.
 - 2. Our good works will lead others to glorify God.
 - D. With the Lord's instructions in our minds, let us turn our attention to some . . .
- III. ADDITIONAL PASSAGES THAT RELATE TO "LIGHT"
 - A. Romans 13:11-14
 - 1. According to vs.11, now is not the time to sleep spiritually.
 - 2. Since this is the case, vs.12 teaches us to:
 - a. "cast off the works of darkness"
 - b. "put on the armor of light."
 - 3. Vs.13&14 show us what this involves.
 - B. Ephesians 5:8-10
 - 1. A person's condition before he becomes a Christian is described as "darkness."
 - 2. A Christian's condition is described as "light in the Lord."
 - 3. Christians are responsible for walking "as children of light."

- 4. Vs.9 mentions "the fruit of the Spirit" (Galatians 5:22-23).
- C. Philippians 2:14-16
 - 1. Christians are to "shine as lights in the world."
 - 2. To accomplish this we must:
 - a. "do all things without murmurings and disputings"
 - b. hold "forth the word of life."
- D. 1 John 1:5-7
 - 1. Christians are to "walk in the light as He [God] is in the light."
 - 2. A person who claims to have fellowship with God while walking in darkness is a liar.
 - 3. Those who walk in the light as God is in the light:
 - a. have fellowship with God
 - b. are continually cleansed by the Lord's blood.

Conclusion:

- 1. In the beginning the world needed light, and God created it (Genesis 1:1-4a).
- 2. Years later the world needed a special kind of light, and God sent Jesus to provide it (John 12:46).
- 3. The world needs light today, and the Lord's people are responsible for reflecting His light by doing His will.
- 4. In Matthew 5:13-16 was Jesus talking to you?
- 5. When others observe you, can they identify you as "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world?"
