## Let Us Trust in the Lord After He Saves Us

(Psalm 118:8-9)

## Introduction:

- 1. These verses touch on the value of "trusting in the Lord" -- trusting in Him is better than putting confidence in men, including princes.
- 2. This morning we studied passages that relate to "trusting in the Lord for salvation."
- 3. The Scriptures also teach that we are to continue "trusting in the Lord after He saves us."
- 4. In our lesson we will point out:
  - a. where the Lord is
  - b. what the Lord does
  - c. what the Lord wants us to do.

## Discussion:

- I. TO TRUST IN THE LORD WE MUST KNOW WHERE HE IS
  - A. After He was resurrected Jesus was with His followers 40 days (Acts 1:1-3).
  - B. After this 40-day period Jesus ascended to heaven (Luke 24:50-51).
  - C. More specifically, in heaven Jesus "sat on the right hand of God" (Mark 16:19).
  - D. During His trials this is where Jesus said He would be (Luke 22:66-69).
  - E. At the present time Jesus is at the Father's right hand.
    - 1. This is where Stephen saw the Lord (Acts 7:55).
    - 2. Peter said that Jesus "is on the right hand of God" (1 Peter 3:20-21).
- II. TO TRUST IN THE LORD WE MUST KNOW WHAT HE DOES AT THE FATHER'S RIGHT HAND
  - A. He "intercedes" on behalf of His followers (Romans 8:34).
  - B. He rules as "the head of His church" (Ephesians 1:15-23).
  - C. He is "God's spokesman" (Hebrews 1:1-3).
  - D. He is "High Priest" (Hebrews 8:1; 10:11-14).
- III. TO TRUST IN THE LORD WE MUST FULFILL OUR RESPONSIBILITIES TO HIM AS HE DOES THE FATHER'S WILL AT THE FATHER'S RIGHT HAND
  - A. We are to focus on Him as we run the race (Hebrews 12:1-3).
  - B. We are to seek things that are above (Colossians 3:1-4).

## Conclusion:

- 1. Before we determine whether people are trustworthy, we want to know them.
- 2. The better we know the Lord the more we will trust Him.
- 3. I hope that our study of these passages has helped us to increase our knowledge of the Lord so our trust in Him will grow.
