## Guidelines for Having a Good Conscience (Acts 24:16)

Introduction:

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- 1. Paul's statement recorded in Acts 24:16 was made before Governor Felix.
- 2. As Paul spoke before Felix, he talked about having "a conscience void of offence."
  - a. He wanted to have a good conscience "toward God, and toward men."
  - b. He wanted to have a good conscience "always."
  - c. He "exercised himself" to always have a good conscience toward God and men.
- 3. Having a good conscience is not accomplished by accident -- it requires constant attention and effort [exercise] on our part.
- 4. In our lesson we are considering 3 important "guidelines for having a good conscience." <u>Discussion</u>:
  - FIRST, WE MUST LOVE GOD
    - A. Loving God is "the first and great commandment" (Matthew 22:35-38).
    - B. God is to be loved "with all the heart, with all the soul, and with all the mind."
    - C. Those who love God:
      - 1. will keep His commandments (1 John 5:3)
      - 2. will love His Word (Psalm 119:97).
    - D. By hiding God's Word in our hearts we will avoid sin (Psalm 119:11).
      - 1. We will do those things that God wants us to do.
      - 2. We will abstain from those things that God wants us to avoid.
    - E. To always have a conscience void of offense toward God, we must exercise ourselves by loving God.
- II. SECOND, WE MUST LOVE OUR NEIGHBORS
  - A. Loving our neighbors is "the second commandment" (Matthew 22:39).
  - B. We are to love our neighbors "as ourselves."
  - C. By loving our neighbors as ourselves:
    - 1. we will practice the Golden Rule by treating others as we wish to be treated (Matthew 7:12)
    - 2. we will fulfill our responsibilities toward our fellow man.
      - a. Romans 13:8-10
      - b. Galatians 5:13-15
      - c. James 2:8-9
  - D. To always have a conscience void of offence toward our fellow man, we must exercise ourselves by loving our neighbors.
- III. THIRD, WE MUST DO ALL IN WORD OR DEED IN THE NAME OF THE LORD
  - A. This principle is revealed in Colossians 3:17.
  - B. We are to say and do those things that Christ has authorized us to say and do.
  - C. This includes our responsibilities to God and our fellow man.
  - D. We learn what Christ authorizes us to say and do by "letting His Word dwell in us richly in all wisdom" (Colossians 3:16).
  - E. To always have a conscience void of offence toward God and our fellow man, we must exercise ourselves by doing all in word or deed in the name of the Lord.

## Conclusion:

- 1. Let us adopt Paul's plan for having a good conscience that he mentioned in Acts 24:16.
- 2. Let us exercise ourselves to always have a good conscience toward God and our fellow man by:
  - a. loving God with all the heart, soul, and mind
  - b. loving our neighbors as ourselves
  - c. doing all in word or deed in the name of the Lord.
