A Lesson from the 85th Psalm

Introduction:

- 1. According to Luke 24:44, Jesus considered the Psalms to be Scripture, including them with the Law of Moses and the writings of the prophets.
- 2. Since the Psalms are part of the Old Testament Scriptures, they "were written for our learning" (Romans 15:4).
- 3. In our lesson we are studying an important subject mentioned in Psalm 85:6: "revival."
- 4. As a practical matter, when studying the Psalms we must be aware of the setting for each one.
- 5. Let us first point out . . .

Discussion:

- I. THE SETTING FOR PSALM 85
 - A. In 606 BC, Babylon took control of Judah (the southern kingdom), and the captivity lasted 70 years.
 - B. In 536 BC, Cyrus conquered Babylon and allowed the Jews who so desired to return to Palestine so the temple could be rebuilt.
 - C. According to Psalm 85,:
 - 1. God had allowed His people to be released from captivity (vs.1)
 - 2. God had forgiven His people (vs.2)
 - 3. God's people still needed something very special (vs.6) -- "revival."
 - D. God's people in Judah needed revival many years ago after the captivity ended, and God's people still need it today.
 - E. Thankfully, . . .
- II. THE SCRIPTURES REVEAL IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT REVIVAL
 - A. The Scriptures explain what revival is.
 - 1. Revive: to return to life, to renew, to restore, to strengthen
 - 2. To illustrate, after Jesus died, He rose and revived (Romans 14:9).
 - B. The Scriptures explain who the source of revival is.
 - 1. The question in vs.6 indicates that God is the source of revival -- "thou."
 - 2. David clearly identified God as the source of revival in Psalm 138:7.
 - C. The Scriptures explain how God brings about revival.
 - 1. In vs.8 the writer said, "I will hear what God the Lord will speak."
 - 2. The Lord's words bring life (John 6:63b).
 - D. The Scriptures reveal the ones who need revival.
 - 1. The question in vs.6 indicates that God's people need revival -- "us."
 - 2. According to Isaiah 57:15, God revives those who are humble and contrite.
 - E. The Scriptures show how often we need revival.
 - 1. The question in vs.6 indicates that we need revival continually -- "again."
 - 2. Daily inward renewal is mentioned in 2 Corinthians 4:16.
 - F. The Scriptures explain that revival produces something very special.
 - 1. The question in vs.6 mentions joy in connection with revival from God.
 - 2. This point is further emphasized in Psalm 126.

Conclusion:

- 1. From time to time, God's people need to be revived.
- 2. When that time arrives, let us remember that:
 - a. God is the source of revival
 - b. God revives His people through His Word
 - c. God revives those who are humble and contrite
 - d. God will revive us as often as needed
 - e. God's revival produces joy.
