## How to Be In Peace, Without Spot, and Blameless

(2 Peter 3:14)

## Introduction:

- 1. As Peter concluded his teaching on the Lord's return, he called upon the Lord's people to be diligent that we "may be found of Him in peace, without spot, and blameless."
- 2. Notice how similar Peter's statement is to the one that the apostle Paul wrote in 1 Thessalonians 5:23 -- being "preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ."
- 3. In our lesson we are studying the instructions in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-22.
- 4. They teach us "how to be in peace, without spot, and blameless" so we can be prepared for the Lord's return.

## Discussion:

- I. (vs.16) REJOICE EVERMORE
  - A. Similar admonitions are given in Philippians 3:1a; 4:4.
  - B. Most people are able to rejoice when things go well in their lives; however, Christians are to rejoice "evermore."
  - C. Our joy is an inner peace of mind that we experience because of having a right relationship with God -- it is not based on external circumstances.
  - D. One thing that will help us to rejoice evermore is to . . .
- II. (vs.17) PRAY WITHOUT CEASING
  - A. To help us understand:
    - 1. (Luke 18:1) "Men ought always to pray and not to faint."
    - 2. Ephesians 6:18
    - 3. (Colossians 4:2) "Continue in prayer."
    - 4. We must be like Jesus who prayed often.
  - B. Prayer shows that we depend upon God and not on ourselves.
  - C. As we pray we must remember to . . .
- III. (vs.18) GIVE THANKS IN EVERYTHING: FOR THIS IS THE WILL OF GOD
  - A. God is the source of the many blessings we enjoy (James 1:17).
  - B. We must express our gratitude to Him (Ephesians 5:20).
- IV. (vs.19) QUENCH NOT THE SPIRIT
  - A. (Ephesians 6:17) The sword of the Spirit is the Word of God.
  - B. (Hebrews 3:7) The Spirit speaks through the Scriptures.
  - C. We guench the Spirit if we turn a deaf ear to what He says.
  - D. Rather than quench Him, we must "be filled with the Spirit" (Ephesians 5:18).
  - E. Closely related is the next admonition.
- V. (vs.20) DESPISE NOT PROPHESYINGS
  - A. Prophesyings: messages from God
  - B. Messages from God must not be despised because they are for our benefit (2 Timothy 3:16).
  - C. We must not blindly accept what we are taught -- we are to . . .
- VI. (vs.21) PROVE ALL THINGS; HOLD FAST THAT WHICH IS GOOD
  - A. All things are to be put to the test.
  - B. The Bible is the standard by which we determine whether something is good or bad.
  - C. If something is proved to be good, we must hold fast to it.
  - D. If something is proved to be bad, . . .
- VII. (vs.22) ABSTAIN FROM ALL APPEARANCE OF EVIL
  - A. When Jesus returns we will be judged on the basis of our works (2 Corinthians 5:10).
  - B. We must be sure that our works have been good and not evil.

## Conclusion:

- 1. One day Jesus is coming back.
- 2. If we obey the Gospel and practice the instructions that the Lord has given us, we will be found of Him "in peace, without spot, and blameless."
