## <u>Let Us Study 3 Things about God's Kingdom</u> (Acts 19:8)

## Introduction:

- 1. In the book of Acts we read about some great preachers who served the Lord during the early days of the church's existence.
- 2. Two of these preachers were Paul the apostle and Philip the evangelist.
- 3. These men had something in common.
  - a. According to Acts 19:8, Paul went to the synagogue in Ephesus where he disputed and persuaded "the things concerning the kingdom of God."
  - b. We learn from Acts 8:12 that Philip preached "the things concerning the kingdom of God" in Samaria.
- 4. The preaching of these men indicates that studying "things concerning the kingdom of God" is very important.
- 5. In our lesson we are concentrating on "3 things about God's kingdom."
  - a. God's kingdom has a King.
  - b. God's kingdom has subjects.
  - c. God's kingdom has a law.
- 6. Let us begin by showing that . . .

## Discussion:

- I. THE KINGDOM OF GOD HAS A KING
  - A. In order for a kingdom to exist there must be a king.
  - B. A king is a leader who possesses power and authority, he reveals his law to his subjects, and he receives honor and respect from his subjects.
  - C. In God's kingdom, Jesus is King.
    - 1. This point is made very effectively in Hebrews 1:7-8 (Psalm 45:6).
    - 2. In 1 Timothy 6:15 Jesus is described as "King of kings, and Lord of Lords."
    - 3. As King, Jesus possesses all authority (Matthew 28:18).
    - 4. He alone is the head of His church (Ephesians 1:22-23; Colossians 1:18).
  - D. In addition to having a King, . . .
- II. THE KINGDOM OF GOD HAS CITIZENS
  - A. In order for a kingdom to exist there must be citizens or subjects.
  - B. In God's kingdom, Christians are citizens.
    - 1. (Ephesians 2:19) Christians are "fellowcitizens with the saints, and of the household of God."
    - 2. (Colossians 1:13) The citizens of God's kingdom are those who have been delivered *"from the power of darkness"* and *"translated"* into it (see 2:12-13).
    - 3. (Acts 2:47) To become citizens of God's kingdom we must be saved, and the Lord will add us to it.
  - C. The citizens of God's kingdom are subject to the King (Colossians 3:17).
  - D. In addition to having a King and citizens, . . .
- III. THE KINGDOM OF GOD HAS A LAW
  - A. In order for a kingdom to exist it must have a law or system of laws.
  - B. In God's kingdom, the New Testament of Christ is the law.
    - 1. (Hebrews 9:15) Jesus, the King, "is the mediator of the new testament."
    - 2. (Hebrews 8:6) Jesus "is the mediator of a better covenant, which was established upon better promises."
  - C. We have an important responsibility concerning our law (Colossians 3:16a).
  - D. Those who comply with the Lord's law enjoy special blessings (James 1:25).

## Conclusion:

- 1. We have examined "3 things concerning the kingdom of God."
- 2. After studying these matters we need to examine ourselves and ask:
  - a. Is Jesus my King?
  - b. Am I a citizen of His kingdom?
  - c. Am I complying with His law?
