What Can We Learn from Simon Peter?

(Matthew 10:2-4)

Introduction:

- 1. Jesus chose 12 men to serve as His apostles.
- 2. Their names are listed in Matthew 10:2-4.
- 3. In our lesson we are studying passages that reveal information [both positive and negative] about Simon Peter.
- 4. Our purpose for doing so is to help us learn information that will help us to be the people that the Lord wants us to be.
- 5. Let us begin with . . .

Discussion:

SOME POSITIVE INFORMATION

- A. Peter demonstrated great faith when Jesus called him.
 - 1. Peter was introduced to Jesus by his brother, Andrew (John 1:40-42).
 - a. From the beginning, Jesus saw potential in Peter.
 - b. Jesus indicated that Peter would develop into a strong follower of His.
 - 1) Jesus gave "the keys of the kingdom" to Peter (Matthew 16:19).
 - 2) Peter wrote 2 of the New Testament letters.
 - 2. Peter eventually left his fishing nets to follow Jesus (Matthew 4:18-20).
- B. Peter clearly understood who Jesus is.
 - 1. (Matthew 16:16) Peter identified Jesus as "the Christ, the Son of the living God."
 - 2. (John 6:66-69) Peter maintained this belief when many of the Lord's disciples left Him.
- C. In a positive way, Peter demonstrated great faith when Jesus called him, and he clearly understood who Jesus is.
- D. Let us turn our attention to . . .
- II. SOME NEGATIVE INFORMATION
 - A. (Matthew 16:21-23) Peter rebuked Jesus -- he was not willing to accept God's will.
 - B. (John 13:6-8a) Peter refused to allow Jesus to wash his feet.
 - 1. Jesus was trying to teach Peter and the other apostles a lesson, and He reasoned with Peter in vs.8b.
 - 2. Thankfully, Peter had a change of mind (vs.9).
- III. WHAT LESSONS DID PETER NEED TO LEARN?
 - A. To be a true follower of Christ, a person must "deny self" (Luke 9:23).
 - 1. Peter denied himself when he left his nets to follow Jesus.
 - 2. However, at other times he was unwilling to deny himself, and this affected his relationship with the Lord.
 - B. To be a true follower of Christ, a person must not be ashamed of Jesus and His words (Luke 9:26).
 - 1. Peter was not ashamed when he identified Jesus as God's Son.
 - 2. However, at other times he was unwilling to submit to the Lord's instructions, and this affected his relationship with Jesus.
 - 3. Peter needed to learn that it will do no good to call Jesus "Lord" without following His teachings (Luke 6:46).

Conclusion:

- 1. Peter clearly made some serious mistakes, but he was wise in that he learned from them.
- 2. He had a number of weaknesses, but he overcame them.
- 3. He became one of the Lord's most devoted followers, and the Lord used him to lead many souls to become Christians.
- 4. What can we learn from Simon Peter?
 - a. Let us maintain our faith that Jesus is God's Son.
 - b. Let us submit to the Lord's will by denying ourselves.
 - c. Let us never be ashamed of the Lord or His words.
