Why Love Is the Greatest

(1 John 4:7-19)

Introduction:

- 1. The last verse of 1 Corinthians 13 ["the love chapter of the Bible"] states that love is the greatest [greater than faith and hope].
- 2. In our lesson we are examining the information presented in 1 John 4:7-19.
- 3. In these verses:
 - a. John wrote about God's love
 - b. John showed how God's children are to reciprocate His love.
- 4. John's message will help us understand "why love is the greatest."

Discussion:

- I. "GOD'S LOVE" IS THE FOUNDATION OF JOHN'S MESSAGE
 - A. John indicated that God is the source of love.
 - 1. (vs.7b) "Love is of God."
 - 2. (vs.8b) "God is love."
 - B. John continued by explaining how God demonstrated His love.
 - 1. (vs.9-10) God demonstrated His love by sending His Son into the world to be "the propitiation for our sins" (see 2:1-2).
 - 2. (vs.14) John and his fellow apostles saw and testified that the Father sent Jesus to be our Savior (see 1:1-2).
 - C. In laying the foundation for his message, John wrote about God's love.
 - D. Such love deserves to be reciprocated -- this leads us to the next point.
- II. GOD'S CHILDREN ARE TO RECIPROCATE HIS LOVE IN 2 WAYS
 - A. First, God's children are to reciprocate His love by loving Him (vs.15-19).
 - 1. Why do God's children love Him? (vs.19 -- "because he first loved us").
 - 2. Those who love God enjoy special blessings.
 - a. (vs.16) Those who love God dwell in Him and vice versa.
 - b. (vs.17) Those who love God will have boldness at the judgment.
 - c. (vs.18) Those who love God overcome fear.
 - 3. God's children love Him because He first loved us.
 - 4. There is another way in which God's children are to reciprocate His love.
 - B. The second way God's children are to reciprocate His love is by loving each other.
 - 1. See vs.7a, 11
 - 2. Special blessings are associated with loving God's children.
 - a. vs.7c
 - b. vs.12b
 - 3. John also touched on the spiritual condition of those who do not love God's children.
 - a. vs.8a
 - b. vs.20
 - C. John concluded his message on love in vs.21.
- III. ADDITIONAL PASSAGES FROM OTHER APOSTLES
 - A. Ephesians 5:1-2
 - B. Colossians 3:12-14
 - C. 1 Peter 1:22-23; 4:8

Conclusion:

- 1. We know that God loves us because He demonstrated His love.
- 2. God requires His children to reciprocate His love by:
 - a. loving Him
 - b. loving one another.
- 3. Our response to these requirements indicates whether we are God's true children.
- 4. After studying these passages, let us grow in our understanding of "why love is the greatest."
