Let Us Heed Solomon's Advice

(Ecclesiastes 9:10)

Introduction:

- 1. Ecclesiastes is a very interesting book.
- 2. According to the opening verse (1:1), Solomon was the writer.
- 3. In his book it seems that Solomon dealt with some lessons he had learned the hard way.
- 4. He mentioned a number of mistakes he had made.
- 5. He also passed on some good advice that we need to carefully consider.
- 6. In our lesson we are concentrating on the wise advice that Solomon gave in Ecclesiastes 9:10.

Discussion:

- I. THIS VERSE INFORMS US THAT WE ARE HEADED FOR THE GRAVE
 - A. The grave is not a pleasant subject by any means, but the Bible teaches that it is a reality.
 - 1. (Ecclesiastes 3:2) There is "a time to die."
 - 2. (Ecclesiastes 9:5a) "For the living know that they shall die."
 - 3. (Hebrews 9:27) "It is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment."
 - B. Solomon also informs us that certain things do not exist in the grave.
 - 1. There is no "work" in the grave.
 - 2. There is no "device" [planning] in the grave.
 - 3. There is no "knowledge" in the grave.
 - 4. There is no "wisdom" in the grave.
 - C. Since none of these things exist in the grave, we need to heed this very wise advice: "Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might."
 - D. In the grave it will be too late to pursue these things; therefore, we must give careful attention to them while we can.
 - E. Pursuing these things with our might will help us to be prepared when our time comes to go to the grave.
- II. THIS VERSE TEACHES US TO GIVE CAREFUL ATTENTION TO "KNOWLEDGE" AND "WISDOM"
 - A. By contrasting a wise man and a foolish man we can see why pursuing knowledge and wisdom is so important.
 - 1. (Proverbs 1:5a) "A wise man will hear, and will increase learning."
 - 2. (Proverbs 1:7b) "Fools despise wisdom and instruction."
 - 3. This contrast indicates which man will please the Lord.

- B. Gaining knowledge and wisdom requires diligent study, and this is not easy; however, this is something that the Lord wants us to do while we can.
- C. When we gain knowledge and wisdom we are imitating Christ (Luke 2:52).
- D. Since knowledge and wisdom do not exist in the grave we must follow Solomon's advice (Ecclesiastes 9:10a).
- III. THIS VERSE TEACHES US TO GIVE CAREFUL ATTENTION TO "WORK"
 - A. From the beginning God has instructed man to work (Genesis 2:15).
 - B. The New Testament teaches Christians to be good workers (Ephesians 6:5-8; Colossians 3:22-25).
 - C. Being a good worker requires great effort, but the Lord wants us to give careful attention to our work.
 - D. Since there is no work in the grave we must follow Solomon's advice (Ecclesiastes 9:10a).
- IV. THIS VERSE TEACHES US TO GIVE CAREFUL ATTENTION TO "DEVICE"
 - A. <u>Device</u>: planning, setting goals
 - B. The rich young ruler shows why we must give careful attention to our plans and goals (Matthew 19:16-22).
 - 1. He had a worthy goal, but he was not willing to pay the price to achieve it.
 - 2. Consequently, he did not reach his goal.
 - C. The Lord wants us to give careful attention to spiritual plans and goals, and He wants us to pay the price to achieve them while we can (Matthew 6:33).
- D. Since there is no device in the grave we must follow Solomon's advice (Ecclesiastes 9:10a). Conclusion:
 - 1. By properly applying and following Solomon's advice we can be prepared to go to the grave when our lives end.
 - 2. We can have the confidence expressed by Paul in 2 Timothy 4:6-8.
