Let Us Seek Wise Advice (2 Chronicles 10:6-11)

Introduction:

- 1. In these verses Rehoboam sought "counsel" [advice] from 2 groups of people: the old men and the young men.
- 2. As a result of following unwise advice, Rehoboam made a decision that cost him dearly.
- 3. In our lesson we are emphasizing the importance of seeking wise advice.
- 4. We all need "counsel" [advice] from time to time.
- 5. It is extremely important for us:
 - a. to go to the right sources for advice
 - b. to carefully examine the advice that we receive from others.
- 6. Let us begin our study by examining . . .

Discussion:

- I. THE SITUATION THAT EXISTED
 - A. (9:30-31) After ruling Israel 40 years, Solomon died, and he was succeeded by his son Rehoboam.
 - B. (10:1) The Israelites went to Shechem to make Rehoboam their king.
 - C. (10:2) Jeroboam returned from Egypt (see 1 Kings 11:26-32, 40).
 - D. (10:3-4) Jeroboam and the Israelites made a request of Rehoboam.
 - E. (10:5) Rehoboam told them to return to him after 3 days.
- II. (vs.6-11) TO SETTLE THIS SITUATION REHOBOAM SOUGHT COUNSEL
 - A. (vs.6-7) He asked the old men for their counsel, but he rejected it (vs.8a).
 - B. (vs.8b-11) He asked the young men for their counsel, and they advised him to make the people's burdens even heavier.
 - C. Did Rehoboam:
 - 1. seek counsel from the Lord?
 - 2. pray or consult a reliable prophet?
- III. (vs.12-15) REHOBOAM RELATED HIS DECISION TO JEROBOAM AND THE ISRAELITES
- IV. (vs.16-19) REHOBOAM'S DECISION THAT WAS BASED ON UNWISE ADVICE COST HIM MUCH OF HIS KINGDOM

Conclusion:

- 1. It is highly unlikely that we will ever find ourselves in the same situation that Rehoboam was in; however, we all occasionally need "counsel" [advice].
- 2. It is extremely important for us:
 - a. to go to the right sources for advice
 - b. to carefully examine the advice that we receive from others.
- 3. Many times we make decisions based on advice that comes from other people.
- 4. If we receive unwise advice we may make unwise decisions and then take unwise courses of action (Proverbs 13:20).
- 5. Above all, let us seek counsel from the Lord (Proverbs 19:20-21; 3:5-6).
