

Let Us Answer David's Questions  
(Psalm 139:7)

Introduction:

1. In Psalm 139:7, David asked 2 questions that relate to being in God's presence.
2. In our lesson we will answer them.
  - a. First, we will consider why we need to answer David's questions.
  - b. Next, we will search the Scriptures to find an answer to David's questions.
  - c. Finally, we will make several points of application.

Discussion:

- I. WHY WE NEED TO ANSWER DAVID'S QUESTIONS
  - A. As you know we have faced a variety of difficulties lately, including:
    1. the taking of innocent lives in worship services
    2. a worldwide illness.
  - B. When difficulties such as these develop, people sometimes express their doubts concerning God's presence.
  - C. Such doubts are very serious because they can lead to:
    1. misunderstandings about God's nature
    2. unbelief.
  - D. We need to answer David's questions for our benefit and so we may be able to assist others who are searching for answers.
- II. THANKFULLY, THE BIBLE ANSWERS DAVID'S QUESTIONS
  - A. Let us examine information presented in Psalm 139.
    1. David showed how he was always in God's presence, regardless of:
      - a. location (vs.8-10)
      - b. time of day (vs.11-12; Psalm 121:4-6).
    2. (vs.13-16) David was in God's presence when he was in his mother's womb.
    3. Notice how being in God's presence affected David.
      - a. (vs.1-4) David realized that God was aware of his thoughts, his actions, and his words.
      - b. (vs.23-24) David wanted his life to be right with God.
  - B. Let us observe how God was with great Old Testament characters, including:
    1. Joseph (Genesis 39:1-3, 20-23)
    2. Moses (Exodus 3:12)
    3. Joshua (Joshua 1:5, 9).
  - C. The New Testament teaches that the Lord is with His followers today.
    1. Jesus made this promise in Matthew 28:20b.
    2. He is present when His followers worship (Matthew 18:20).
    3. He is present at all times (Philippians 4:5b -- "*The Lord is at hand*").
  - D. The Bible answers David's questions by clearly showing that the Lord's people are always in His presence.
- III. LET US MAKE SEVERAL POINTS OF APPLICATION
  - A. The Lord's presence should affect our behavior (Hebrews 4:13).
  - B. Because He is present we need to approach Him for help (Hebrews 4:16).
    1. He will help us when we face temptation (Matthew 6:13a).
    2. He will help us when we face difficulties (2 Timothy 4:16-18).
    3. He will help us overcome covetousness and fear (Hebrews 13:5-6).

Conclusion:

1. David asked 2 interesting questions in Psalm 139:7.
2. According to the Bible, we are always in God's presence, and He is aware of our thoughts, our words, our actions, and the condition of our hearts.
