The Great Physician Can Cure a Troubled Heart

(John 14:1-6)

Introduction:

- 1. Jesus has often been called "the Great Physician."
- 2. We can appreciate this expression when we consider how Jesus healed multitudes of people during His ministry (Matthew 4:23-24; 8:16-17; 12:15; 14:14; 15:30-31; 19:1-2).
- 3. By healing such a wide variety of illnesses and diseases, the Great Physician could be referred to as a "General Practitioner."
- 4. In our lesson we are emphasizing how the Great Physician is also a "Specialist" in that "He can cure a troubled heart."
- 5. Jesus spoke to His disciples about this kind of cure in John 14:1-6.
- 6. As we study these verses we will examine:
 - a. why Jesus made these statements to His disciples
 - b. some "instructions" and some "information" that Jesus gave.
- 7. The first step we need to take is to determine . . .

Discussion:

- I. WHY JESUS MADE THESE STATEMENTS TO HIS DISCIPLES
 - A. Jesus had just eaten the Passover meal with His disciples (John 13:1-2).
 - B. On that occasion Jesus gave instructions for His Supper (Luke 22:19-20).
 - C. Jesus also informed His disciples that He was leaving them (John 13:33).
 - D. Peter's response in vs.36-37 indicates that he was troubled.
 - E. Jesus did not want His followers to remain in their upset condition.
 - F. We understand why Jesus made these statements to His disciples -- they were upset after Jesus told them He was leaving and they could not go with Him.
 - G. We have something in common with the disciples -- we also face circumstances that can cause our hearts to be troubled.
 - H. We need to listen carefully to the instructions and the information that Jesus gave to His disciples to help their troubled hearts.
- II. JESUS GAVE HIS DISCIPLES SOME "INSTRUCTIONS" TO CURE THEIR TROUBLED HEARTS
 - A. First, He said in vs.1b, "Believe in God."
 - 1. As the Bible begins, it declares that God exists (Genesis 1:1).
 - 2. The Bible also provides evidence for God's existence (Psalm 19:1-6).
 - 3. How does believing in God help us when our hearts are troubled?
 - a. During times of trouble God provides help (Psalm 46:1).

- b. God also provides comfort (2 Corinthians 1:3-4a).
- c. Those who believe in God make the statement that the apostle Paul made in 2 Corinthians 4:8.
- B. Second, Jesus said in vs.1c, "Believe also in me."
 - 1. The Bible declares that:
 - a. Jesus came to earth (John 1:14)
 - 1) While on earth Jesus faced the same trials we face (Hebrews 4:15).
 - 2) Consequently, He provides assistance to His followers (Hebrews 4:16).
 - b. Jesus is God's Son on the basis of His miracles (John 20:30-31).
 - 2. Satan uses trouble to try to prevent us from believing in Christ.
 - 3. Jesus said, "Believe in God, believe also in me."
- III. JESUS PRESENTED SOME "INFORMATION" TO HIS DISCIPLES TO CURE THEIR TROUBLED HEARTS
 - A. (vs.2) Jesus spoke about His Father's house [heaven].
 - 1. He indicated that there is plenty of room in His Father's house.
 - 2. He said He was going there to prepare a place for His followers.
 - 3. Jesus assured His disciples that they could eventually be there with Him.
 - 4. Thomas was confused, but we can know the way to the Father -- Jesus is the only way.
 - B. (vs.3) Jesus also spoke about His return.
 - 1. Earlier, Jesus said that the resurrection and the judgment will occur when He returns (John 5:28-29).
 - 2. Those who are prepared for His return will be blessed with eternal life.

Conclusion:

- 1. Is your heart troubled today?
- 2. Do you believe in God?
- 3. Do you believe in Jesus?
- 4. Do you have the hope of going to heaven?
- 5. Are you prepared for the Lord's return?
- 6. "Rest" is available to those who come to Christ (Matthew 11:28-30).
