We Ought to Avoid Disobeying God

(Acts 5:29)

Introduction:

- 1. This verse records the first part of the apostles' response as they were interrogated by the high priest before the Jewish council.
- This morning we covered passages that emphasize how "we ought to obey God."
- 3. This evening we are taking a different approach -- we are covering passages that emphasize how "we ought to avoid disobeying God."
- 4. We are examining 3 Bible characters who disobeyed God's instructions so we can avoid their mistake.

Discussion:

- I. LET US EXAMINE THE DISOBEDIENCE OF MOSES (Numbers 20)
 - A. On this occasion when the people needed water, God told Moses what to do (vs.1-8).
 - B. The response of Moses is recorded in vs.9-11.
 - C. God did not allow Moses to enter the Promised Land (vs.12-13).
- II. LET US EXAMINE THE DISOBEDIENCE OF A PROPHET (1 Kings 13)
 - A. (vs.1-3) God sent this prophet to deliver a message to Jeroboam.
 - B. (vs.7-10) God gave this prophet some instructions to follow.
 - C. (vs.15-19) Another prophet gave him some different instructions that he followed.
 - D. (vs.20-26) The prophet who disobeyed was killed by a lion.
- III. LET US EXAMINE THE DISOBEDIENCE OF UZZA (1 Chronicles 13)
 - A. (vs.1-6) David and the leaders of Israel decided to move the Ark of the Covenant.
 - B. (vs.7) The Ark was transported on a new cart driven by Uzza and Ahio.
 - 1. The Ark was to be carried by the sons of Kohath (Numbers 7:9).
 - 2. Touching any holy thing was forbidden (Numbers 4:15).
 - C. (vs.9-10) Uzza died when he touched the Ark to steady it.
 - D. (vs.11-12) David was upset and asked how he should move the ark.
 - E. He found his answer and realized his mistake (1 Chronicles 15:2, 11-15).

 - a. obey God
 - b. avoid disobeying God.
