Jesus' Resurrection Reflects the Value of Your Soul (Matthew 16:26)

Introduction:

- 1. By asking the questions recorded in this verse, Jesus indicated that a person's soul is his most valuable possession.
- 2. Since our souls are so precious, saving them is extremely important.
- 3. There are many factors that relate to salvation.
- 4. Previously, we have studied "God's grace" and "Jesus' death."
- 5. A proper understanding of God's grace and Jesus' death will lead us to conclude that they both reflect the value of our souls.
- 6. Today we are studying another important subject that relates to salvation: "Jesus' resurrection."
- Our study will lead us to conclude: "Jesus' resurrection reflects the value of your soul."
- 8. Before we get to the main point of our lesson, . . .

Discussion:

- I. LET US FIRST BE REMINDED OF THE BASIC FACTS CONCERNING JESUS' RESURRECTION
 - A. Jesus' resurrection was prophesied in the Old Testament.
 - 1. Isaiah 53:9-10
 - 2. Psalm 16:8-11; Acts 2:22-31
 - 3. (1 Corinthians 15:3-4) Jesus "rose again the third day according to the Scriptures."
 - 4. In addition to being prophesied in the Old Testament, . . .
 - B. Jesus predicted that He would be resurrected (Matthew 16:21; 17:22-23).
 - C. Jesus was raised the third day after He was crucified.
 - 1. He died and was buried on the day of preparation [Friday] (John 19:40-42).
 - 2. His body remained in the tomb over the Sabbath [Saturday].
 - 3. He arose on the third day, the first day of the week [Sunday] (Luke 24:1-8).
 - D. After covering these basics, let us turn our attention to the fact that . . .
- II. JESUS' RESURRECTION REFLECTS THE VALUE OF YOUR SOUL
 - A. Let us examine how this point is made from a negative perspective in the resurrection chapter (1 Corinthians 15:12-19, 20-23).
 - B. From a positive perspective,:
 - 1. Jesus "was raised again for our justification" (Romans 4:25; 6:3-6)
 - 2. Jesus' resurrection gives us hope (1 Peter 1:3-4).

Conclusion:

- 1. How valuable is your soul?
- 2. Jesus answered this question in Matthew 16:26.
- 3. This question is also answered by a careful study of God's grace, Jesus' death, and Jesus' resurrection.
