## Jesus Brought Light into a World of Darkness

(Matthew 4:12-16)

## Introduction:

- 1. In this part of his Gospel, Matthew tells us about the beginning of the Lord's ministry.
  - a. At the end of ch.3 we read about the Lord's baptism (vs.13-17).
  - b. As ch.4 begins we read about the Lord's temptation (vs.1-11).
  - c. We learn from the verses we read earlier (4:12-16) that Jesus went to Galilee where He fulfilled much of His ministry.
  - d. According to 4:17, at this point "Jesus began to preach."
- 2. In our lesson we are concentrating on something that Matthew mentioned in vs.16 -- "Jesus brought light into a world of darkness."
- 3. The first point we need to make is that . . .

## Discussion:

- I. THE SCRIPTURES EMPHASIZE THE FACT THAT JESUS BROUGHT LIGHT INTO A WORLD OF DARKNESS
  - A. A very important prophecy was made in Isaiah 9:1-2.
    - 1. Isaiah mentioned the land belonging to the tribes of Zebulun and Naphtali.
    - 2. This area was eventually known as Galilee.
    - 3. The people in this area would be blessed to see "a great light."
    - 4. Matthew tells us that Jesus fulfilled this prophecy.
  - B. Zacharias, the father of John the Baptist, applied this prophecy to Jesus when John was born (Luke 1:76-79).
  - C. When Jesus was born, Simeon applied this prophecy to Jesus (Luke 2:25-33).
  - D. John began his Gospel (John 1:1-13) by showing how Jesus brought light into the world.
  - E. Let us turn our attention to the fact that . . .
- II. JESUS IDENTIFIED HIMSELF AS "THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD"
  - A. (John 9:5) Jesus said, "I am the light of the world."
  - B. He demonstrated how He is the light of the world by giving sight to a man born blind (John 9:1-7).
  - C. The Lord certainly brought light into this man's life.
  - D. This brings us to our next point.
- III. JESUS EXPLAINED HOW WE RECEIVE THE LIGHT HE CAME TO PROVIDE
  - A. (John 3:16-21) We must believe on Christ and come to the light.
  - B. (John 8:12) We must become followers of the Lord.
  - C. (John 12:44-46) We must believe on God and Christ (see John 1:12-13).

## Conclusion:

- 1. At the beginning the earth was in darkness (Genesis 1:1-2), and God provided light (vs.3).
- 2. Sin caused the world to be in spiritual darkness, and God provided light by sending His Son as "the light of the world."
- 3. Have you come to the Lord to receive the light that He gives?
