The Lord's Presence Is a Special Blessing (Psalm 124)

Introduction:

- 1. In this Psalm David showed how his people had been blessed because the Lord was on Israel's side.
 - a. The Lord prevented the Israelites from being overwhelmed by their enemies.
 - b. The Lord provided protection and deliverance for His people.
 - c. David concluded in vs.8 with a great statement about the Lord's help.
- 2. Today we are focusing our attention on David's descendant, the Lord Jesus.
- 3. In our lesson we are emphasizing how "the Lord's presence is a special blessing."
- 4. The first point we need to make is that . . .

Discussion:

- JESUS PROMISED TO BE WITH HIS FOLLOWERS
 - A. Jesus made this promise in His Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20).
 - B. Jesus said He would "always" be with His followers.
 - C. According to Matthew 18:20, Jesus is with those who gather together in His name.
- II. THE LORD'S FOLLOWERS ARE BLESSED BY HIS PRESENCE IN VARIOUS WAYS
 - A. Jesus is our "mediator" (1 Timothy 2:5).
 - 1. A mediator is a go-between, one who makes peace between 2 parties.
 - 2. To illustrate, Moses mediated between Israel and God (Exodus 32:7-14).
 - 3. Jesus is the "one mediator between God and men."
 - B. Jesus is our "intercessor" (Romans 8:34).
 - 1. An intercessor is one who makes a petition on behalf of someone else.
 - 2. According to Hebrews 7:25, Jesus "ever liveth to make intercession" for those who "come unto God by Him."
 - C. Jesus is our "High Priest" (Hebrews 3:1).
 - 1. One of the main functions of the High Priest is to offer sacrifices on behalf of the people (Hebrews 8:3).
 - 2. Jesus offered Himself as a perfect sacrifice once for all (Hebrews 7:26-27; 10:11-14).
 - 3. As a great and sympathetic High Priest, Jesus provides special blessings to His followers (Hebrews 4:14-16).
 - D. Jesus is our "advocate" [a counselor, one who pleads a case on behalf of someone else] (1 John 2:1-2; Isaiah 9:6).
- III. TWO OF THE LORD'S GREAT SERVANTS SHOWED HOW HE IS WITH HIS FOLLOWERS
 - A. Stephen knew that Jesus was with him when he was killed (Acts 7:54-60).
 - B. Paul knew that Jesus was with him when he was in prison (2 Timothy 4:16-18).

Conclusion:

- 1. "The Lord's presence is a special blessing."
- 2. His presence is dependable -- He will not leave or forsake His followers (Hebrews 13:5-6).
- 3. Let us develop the confidence that David had in Psalm 124:8 -- "Our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth."
