Let Us Hear Jesus (Matthew 17:1-5)

Introduction:

- 1. On this occasion Jesus was transfigured before Peter, James, and John.
- 2. Moses and Elijah appeared with Jesus, and they talked with the Lord.
- 3. This event was made even more special when God spoke.
 - a. He first identified Jesus as His beloved Son in whom He was well pleased.
 - b. He also said, "hear ye Him."
- 4. In our lesson we are placing special emphasis on the fact that God requires us to hear His Son -- "let us hear Jesus."
- 5. Let us begin our study by pointing out that . . .

Discussion:

- . JESUS IS GOD'S SPOKESMAN TODAY
 - A. This point is clearly revealed in Hebrews 1:1-2a.
 - B. In the past God had spoken to the Israelites through Moses who was a great leader.
 - 1. A contrast made between Jesus and Moses in Hebrews 3:1-6 shows how the Lord is superior to Moses.
 - 2. Furthermore, the law that God gave through Moses is no longer in effect (Colossians 2:14).
 - C. In the past God had also spoken to the Israelites through the prophets.
 - 1. Elijah was one of the greatest prophets.
 - 2. We learn from Hebrews 1:2b-3 that Christ is superior to the prophets.
 - D. In the past God had required His people to listen to Moses and the prophets; however, today He requires us to listen to His Son.
 - E. The Lord speaks to us through His Word, the New Testament (Hebrews 9:15).
 - F. Love for God and Christ will lead us to obey His will (1 John 5:3; John 14:15).
 - G. To help us fulfill God's instruction to hear His Son, let us consider . . .
- II. 5 SPECIAL FEATURES OF THE LORD'S WORDS REVEALED IN JOHN
 - A. First, the Lord's words are the Father's words (John 12:49-50; 14:24).
 - B. Second, the Lord's words were validated by His works (John 3:1-2; 14:10).
 - C. Third, the Lord's words are unique (John 6:63, 68; 7:30-32, 45-46).
 - D. Fourth, the Lord's words are associated with very special blessings (John 5:24; 8:31-32; 15:7, 14).
 - E. Fifth, the Lord's words are associated with responsibilities (John 14:21, 23).

Conclusion:

- 1. Let us hear Jesus as the Father commanded.
- 2. As we listen to Him speak in His Word, let us hear with obedient hearts.
