All Things Work Together for Good (Lesson 25)

Introduction:

- 1. The principle revealed in Romans 8:28 is illustrated many times in the Bible.
- 2. For example, Genesis shows how all things worked together for good in Joseph's life.
- 3. In this lesson we are examining the information presented in ch.47.
 - a. Joseph introduced his family to Pharaoh.
 - b. Joseph continued his work of selling grain.
 - c. Jacob's family prospered in Egypt.
 - d. Jacob revealed his burial plans to Joseph.

Discussion:

- I. (vs.1-10) JOSEPH INTRODUCED HIS FAMILY TO PHARAOH
 - A. (vs.1) Joseph informed Pharaoh that his family had moved to Goshen.
 - 1. Earlier,:
 - a. (45:10) when Joseph revealed himself to his brothers, he instructed them to bring their families and their animals to Goshen
 - b. (45:17-20) after Pharaoh learned about Joseph's brothers, he told Joseph to move his family to Egypt, and they could have access to the best that Egypt had to offer
 - c. (46:28-34) Jacob and his family moved to Goshen.
 - 2. After Joseph's family moved to Goshen, Joseph related that information to Pharaoh.
 - B. (vs.2-4) Joseph introduced 5 of his brothers to Pharaoh.
 - 1. Earlier (46:33-34), Joseph had instructed his brothers to tell Pharaoh that their trade was tending animals.
 - 2. When Joseph introduced his brothers to Pharaoh, they told him they were shepherds.
 - 3. They had moved to Goshen so their animals could survive, and they wanted Pharaoh's permission to stay there.
 - C. (vs.5-6) Pharaoh allowed Joseph's family to live in Goshen.
 - D. (vs.7-10) Joseph introduced Jacob to Pharaoh.
 - 1. At the time, Jacob was 130 years old.
 - 2. He had lived a long time, but he had not lived as long as his fathers.
 - a. Abraham lived to be 175 (25:7).
 - b. Isaac lived to be 180 (35:28).
- II. (vs.11-12) JOSEPH'S FATHER, HIS BROTHERS, AND HIS BROTHERS' FAMILIES SETTLED IN EGYPT WHERE HE TOOK CARE OF THEM
- III. (vs.13-26) JOSEPH CONTINUED HIS WORK OF SELLING GRAIN
 - A. (vs.13) The effects of the famine were severe.
 - 1. Pharaoh had put Joseph in charge of storing up grain during the 7 years of plenty.
 - 2. Pharaoh had also put Joseph in charge of selling the grain during the famine.
 - B. (vs.14) In selling grain, Joseph first collected all the money that was available.
 - C. (vs.15-17) In selling grain, Joseph next collected the animals that were available.
 - D. (vs.18-21) In selling grain, Joseph finally collected the land that was available, and the people agreed to be Pharaoh's servants.
 - E. (vs.22) Joseph made an exception with the priests.
 - F. (vs.23-26) Joseph made a law that required the Egyptians to give Pharaoh a fifth of their produce.
 - G. With Joseph overseeing the collection and selling of grain, Pharaoh became a very wealthy and powerful king.
- IV. (vs.27) JACOB'S FAMILY PROSPERED IN EGYPT
- V. (vs.28-31) AFTER LIVING IN EGYPT 17 YEARS, JACOB REVEALED HIS BURIAL PLANS TO JOSEPH
 - A. Jacob did not want to be buried in Egypt -- he wanted to be buried with his fathers.
 - B. Jacob took an oath from Joseph that he would carry out his wishes.
