Keeping Ourselves Unspotted from the World (Lesson 4)

Introduction:

- 1. According to James 1:27, "keeping ourselves unspotted from the world" is an important part of "pure and undefiled religion before God."
- 2. One key to keeping ourselves unspotted from the world is "controlling anxiety [worry]."

Discussion:

- I. LET US FIRST EXAMINE THE INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN IN PHILIPPIANS 4:6
 - A. The first part of this verse says, "Be 'careful' [anxious] for nothing."
 - B. The alternative to anxiety is given in the latter part of this verse -- "in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God."
 - C. These instructions are not hard to understand, but practicing them may be challenging.
- II. A HELPFUL ILLUSTRATION IS FOUND IN 1 SAMUEL 1:9-18
 - A. These verses show how Hannah reacted to a difficult situation.
 - B. Hannah had a problem (vs.6).
 - 1. Because of her problem she was filled with grief.
 - 2. Vs.7 shows that "she wept, and did not eat."
 - C. Hannah set a great example in the way she reacted to her problem.
 - 1. She talked to God through prayer and asked Him to give her a son [a supplication].
 - 2. Eli the priest assured her that God would fulfill her request.
 - 3. (vs.18b) After praying and talking to Eli, Hannah "went her way, and did eat, and her countenance was no more sad."
 - D. Hannah shows us how to practice the instructions given in Philippians 4:6.
 - E. Let us turn our attention to . . .
- III. THE LORD'S TEACHING ABOUT WORRY IN MATTHEW 6:25-34
 - A. (vs.25a) Jesus began by telling His followers not to worry about things such as food, drink, and clothing [the necessities of life].
 - B. Jesus continued by giving 6 reasons why we should not worry about such things.
 - 1. Reason #1 (vs.25b): Our lives are more valuable than food and clothing.
 - a. We need food and clothing to live, but they only benefit us while we live here on earth.
 - b. According to Ecclesiastes 12:13, we live to fulfill a higher purpose.
 - c. Fearing God and keeping His commandments will allow us to live forever.
 - 2. Reason #2 (vs.26): Human beings are much more valuable than the animals God created.
 - a. Jesus mentioned the birds of the air and how God cares for them.
 - b. A human being is certainly more valuable than a sparrow (Matthew 10:29, 31).
 - c. Jesus used this line of reasoning to show that God will provide for His children; therefore, we should not worry.
 - 3. Reason #3 (vs.27): Worrying will not change anything, as illustrated by a person's height.
 - 4. Reason #4 (vs.28-30): Human beings are more valuable than the plants God created.
 - a. Jesus mentioned the lilies of the field, and He showed how God cares for them.
 - b. A human being is certainly more valuable than a plant.
 - c. Jesus used this line of reasoning to show that God will provide His children with things such as clothing; therefore, we should not worry.
 - 5. Reason #5 (vs.31-32): The Lord does not want us to be like heathens in the world.
 - a. When Jesus mentioned "Gentiles," He was referring to unbelieving pagan people.
 - b. Such people are only concerned with things this world has to offer.
 - c. God's people should have higher priorities than heathens.
 - 6. Reason #6 (vs.34): We have enough to be concerned about today.
 - 7. After giving these 6 reasons why we should not worry, . . .
 - C. (vs.33) Jesus told us what to have as our top priorities.
 - 1. We are to seek God's kingdom and His righteousness first.
 - 2. Those who do so will be blessed with the necessities of life.
